WE GOT YOU

Welcome to ZSIS Kindergarten!

Your young child is going to kindergarten. You, Dear Mommy, are a xious, proud, worried, excited, and passing through an emotional rollercoaster. It is 100% normal. Your baby has grown into a relatively independent child who is going to spend time away from you. Will he be able to ask for something he wants? Will he make friends? Will he have to sit alone during recess? Will he miss me? Will he know his way through the building? Will he know how to unwrap his sandwich?



Your baby is a big kid now. He will learn to ask for help. He is super sweet and will make many friends. He has learned a lot from you that now he is ready to interact and communicate. He will surely miss you, but it is not going to be painful. He will be excited about many new things that he'll come back home with many stories to tell you! He will be surrounded with caring adults who will help him navigate through school.

FOCUS ON THE CHILD'S EMOTIONS

Your young child is also feeling apprehensive. He'll be leaving the nest for the first time in his life, or after a long summer vacation. You have already made your research about the school, and you have certainly chosen the one that best suits your perceptions and your child's needs.

- Explain the new daily routine to your child. Have him understand that he will be leaving you every morning to spend a great time at school with friends and teachers. Explain that he will enjoy many things and will have many exciting stories to tell you when he gets back home. Tell him that you will be waiting to hear stories as you prepare a yummy lunch for the 'big kid' he has become!
- Read stories about first days of school to your child. The Kissing Hand is one of our favorite stories. You can find many more stories that will help your child understand and prepare for the new experience ahead.
- Have your child help you pack his lunchbox. Fill it with his favorites. Teach him how to unwrap the sandwich and how to open his water bottle. Assure him that in all cases, the teacher is happy to help him.
- Take him on a tour around the school before the actual school day. He has the right to know where he is going to be spending his mornings.
- When you say good-bye, stay positive. Your child is watching your reaction to figure out how he should feel. If you appear worried or upset, he may be more fearful. Children tend to pick up our emotions. Say a quick, upbeat good-bye; tell him that yes, you will both miss each other, but he will have a great day. And remind him that you'll be back by lunchtime.
- Resist the rescue. Don't run back to the classroom if you hear your child crying. He may, quite understandably, feel sad and a little scared. But if you return to the classroom, you might prolong his distress. Have confidence that the teacher knows how to deal with these situations. After all, she has signed up for this!
- If you're worried, call us as many times as you want to check up on your child.

SHARE YOUR FEARS

Never hesitate to ask us questions and to share your emotions. Inform us of your child's reaction to school after the first week. It is our job to help you.

Preschool is all about fun, activity, growth, and development. Those first days will definitely become beautiful memories soon.

Pray for your child every morning, gear him up with a comforting hug, and send him to his second home - ZSIS Kindergarten.

SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

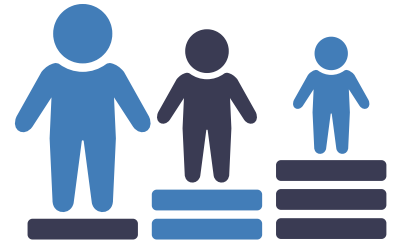

Students are placed in classes based on age groups that fall within certain dates provided by the Ministry of Education. The age requirements for the academic year 2024-2025 are:

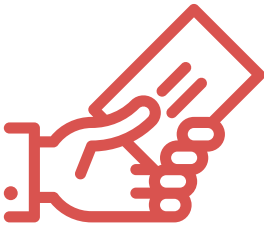

SCHOOL TIMINGS

Arrival	7:30 AM - 8:00 AM
Dismissal	1:00 PM - 2:00 PM

Parents must report their child's absence and back it up with a valid reason.
We stress on the importance of perfect attendance.

DISMISSAL POLICY



Each student receives one Dismissal Card that has to be presented everyday by the child's guardian or driver for pick up.
In case of loss, the guardian must sign a clarification form and purchase a new card for 100 Riyals.
This is to ensure the children's safety and well-being.

EMERGENCY CALLS

During emergencies (God Forbid) school contacts parents through their mobile phones. Always keep your mobile phone on to avoid missing a call or a message.



UNIFORM

Students must wear the school uniform everyday. Keep hair combed back for boys and tied back for girls.

Wear no-lace sneakers with socks.

Send an extra outfit for emergencies. Label with student's name.



MEAL

Students have three mealtimes. Morning breakfast between 7:30 AM and 8:00 AM; main meal at around 10:00 AM; snack time between 1:00 PM and 1:30 PM.

- Make sure your child's lunchbox has enough food and water.
- Keep the lunchbox healthy. Add ready-to-eat fruits and vegetables.
- Junk food like chips, soda, chocolate, and candy are not allowed.
- Hotdog, Basturma, tuna, and eggs are not allowed too.
- Students eat inside their classrooms as they learn to wash their hands before eating, say their prayers, and apply table manners. This is all part of learning.

HYGIENE

- Boys' hair should be cut short enough to be kept away from eyes and not tied back.
- Girls' hair should always be tied back and never let loose.
- Fingernails should be kept short for cleanliness.
- Uniform should be clean at all times.
- Make it a habit for your child to use tissue when sneezing and to cough in elbow.
- Keep your child aware of hygiene habits to keep him safe at all times.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

The school does not allow individual celebrations. We prefer these special days to be celebrated with the family.

BOOKS & BAGS

Books are sent home only when there is homework. They should be kept neat at all times.

You may only send FOLDER BAGS to school. Big bags and roller bags are not allowed inside the classroom. Label your child's folder bag.
